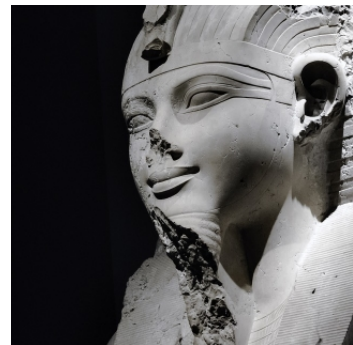
As you know, there has not been a newsletter in awhile. Life has been very difficult with the summer being filled with important, but non-writing related stuff. Hopefully, we're back.
